NEUROLOGY UPDATE & STROKE INTENSIVE REVIEW

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COURSE OVERVIEW

The **58th Annual Neurology Update and Stroke Intensive Review 2025** provides clinicians with a comprehensive review of the most recent developments in the diagnosis and management of neurologic disorders, including cognitive disorders, epilepsy, headache/migraine, movement disorders, multiple sclerosis (MS), neuromuscular disorders, neuro-oncology and sleep disorders and stroke.

In addition, a dedicated stroke seminar will take place Saturday, designed as a stand-alone 8-hour CME activity. For those centers planning to seek stroke center status or already designated as a stroke center, this course will provide stroke teams with the most up-to-date evidence in the field of stroke diagnosis, treatment and prevention.

NEW THIS YEAR

- Saturday Nursing/Stroke Coordinator Symposium

Challenging diagnostic and therapeutic questions will be raised in each session around representative clinical vignettes, targeted reviews of the topic by the faculty and panel discussions. Exchange of information between faculty and attendees will take place during questions and answers sessions after each presentation as well as round table and panel discussions.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The course is aimed primarily at neurologists, stroke specialists, neurosurgeons, psychiatrists, neuro-oncologists, hospitalists, intensivists, fellows, residents, nurses and allied healthcare professionals that participate in the care of neurological patients or work in stroke centers. Internists, general practitioners and cardiologists may also find the topics timely and useful.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

Cognitive Neurology

- Evaluate recently approved amyloid-targeting therapies for early Alzheimer's Disease
- Define amyloid related imaging abnormalities and identify symptoms and treatment recommendations
- Examine emerging treatments and their proposed mechanisms of action
- Assess advances in blood-based biomarkers to diagnose

Alzheimer's Disease

- Evaluate advances in spinal fluid and skin biopsy analyses to diagnose Lewy Body Dementia
- Define incorporation of new biomarkers into clinical practice and their appropriate use

Epilepsy

- Determine when to prescribe the new anti-seizure medications (ASMs) in clinical practice
- Anticipate the potential adverse events resulting from their pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic interaction with other ASMs
- Describe the clinical criteria that needs to be considered in the decision to start an ASM after a "first" unprovoked seizure
- Review the type of diagnostic studies that need to be ordered for a comprehensive evaluation.
- Outline the criteria to be considered in the selection of ASMs following a first recognized epileptic seizure
- Understand how to prescribe the three new ASMs in clinical practice
- Explain the potential adverse events resulting from the pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic interaction with other ASMs

Headache/Migraine

- Evaluate strategies and guidelines for managing migraine headache disorder in women across the lifespan, with focus on menstrual migraine, pregnancy and breastfeeding, and menopause
- Identify common diagnostic and therapeutic challenges and solutions in patients with cluster headache disorder and other trigeminal autonomic cephalalgias
- Examine the clinical implications of medication overuse for headache and the strategies for identification and management
- Assess the updates in headache medicine over the past year, including clinical pearls for implementation into clinical practice

Movement Disorders

- Present the latest diagnostic criteria and treatments for Parkinson's disease
- Describe the motor and nonmotor fluctuations that complicate Parkinson's disease symptoms
- Delineate the diagnosis and treatment of ET and its mimickers
- Evaluate case videos to explain how to distinguish clinically relevant movement disorders

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Multiple Sclerosis

- Improve diagnostic accuracy based on the most current criteria for diagnosis of multiple sclerosis
- Assess the MRI criteria for diagnosis of MS using the most appropriate and current sequences
- Examine Bruton Tyrosine Kinase (BTK) inhibitors as the future therapy for MS

Neuromuscular Disorders

- Outline gaps in amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) diagnosis and treatment
- Recognize early genetic testing as an opportunity to make an early diagnosis as a familial ALS and identify Tofersen as a promising new treatment for genetic forms of ALS and as a model for future genetic treatments
- Describe the utility of following regular serologic neurofilament light chain (NfL) levels as a treatment response
- Distinguish myelitis/radiculitis side effects from ALS using the identification of pain, sensory abnormalities, and rapidly progressive weakness
- Identify common clinical scenarios where electrodiagnostic (EDX) testing is essential for diagnosing nerve injuries, determining prognosis and surgical planning
- Describe how EDX results can influence prognostic expectations of nerve recovery and analyze the advantages of electrodiagnostic in enhancing surgical planning, as well as the limitations and pitfalls
- Illustrate how EDX testing can complement other diagnostic approaches (i.e. Clinical examination, MRI, US)
- Identify the causes of mononeuritis multiplex (MNM)
- Clinically suspect vasculitis neuropathy
- Assess the potential long-term complications of MNM, including nerve damage, disability, and the risk of recurrence
- Develop strategies to track the progression of nerve damage over time and intervene early to prevent further deterioration
- Outline the management strategies for patients with MNM

Neuro-Oncology

- Evaluate the role of the general neurologist in the care of patients with primary and secondary brain tumors
- Explain the advances in Neuro-Oncology in the last year
- Assess the role of new therapies in treating brain tumor patients

Sleep Disorders

- Recognize the importance of sleep, sleep dimensions, and sleep hygiene
- Define the sleep processes including sleep drive and circadian rhythm
- Demonstrate awareness about the pathophysiology and consequences of sleep disorders
- Characterize new technologies in diagnosis and treatment of sleep disorders
- Describe treatment approaches for sleep disorders

Stroke

- Treat appropriate acute ischemic stroke patients with modern strategies that include the extended 24-hour treatment window with thrombolytics, endovascular approaches and antithrombotic
- Establish appropriate management of intracerebral hemorrhage according to current guidelines for the management of hypertensive and lobar hemorrhages as well as the role of reversal strategies in coagulopathic hemorrhages
- Institute measures to prevent a recurrent stroke based on stroke mechanism and in special populations according to the most recent guidelines and evidence
